Please be advised that not every court in the state will accept all of the following forms.

Legal Information:

[Change a name on a Social Security card](#)

If you legally change your name because of marriage, divorce, court order or any other reason, you must tell Social Security so you can get a corrected card for free. The same applies once you receive the I-766 card, Employment Authorization Document (EAD), from the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS). You can find more details on this process by visiting the Social Security Administration's website.

- If you are eligible, you can ask their volunteer attorneys a non-criminal legal question.

- Once your question receives a response, you will get an email. You will need to sign into the website to read your response and ask any additional questions.
